Palliative care improves the quality of life of patients and that of their families who are facing challenges associated with life-threatening illness, whether physical, psychological, social and spiritual. The global need for palliative care will continue to grow as a result of the ageing of populations and the rising burden of non communicable diseases and some communicable diseases. Early delivery of palliative care reduces unnecessary hospital admissions social or spiritual. The quality of life of caregivers improves as well. Each year, an estimated 56.8 million people, including 25.7 million in the last year of life, are in need of palliative care.

Worldwide, Only about 14% of people who need palliative care currently receive it. Adequate national policies, programmes, resources, and training on palliative care among health professionals are urgently needed in order to improve access and the use of health services. Palliative care involves a range of services delivered by a range of professionals who all have equally important roles to play – including physicians, nurses, support workers, paramedics, pharmacists, physiotherapists and volunteers — in support of the patient and their family.
