

Pulse Polio Immunization Drive Report

District, Kerala)

REPORT

The Pulse Polio Immunization drive was successfully conducted on Sunday, October 12, 2025, across three key locations in the Vamanapuram and Venjaramoodu area of the Thiruvananthapuram district. The campaign aimed to administer the Oral Polio Vaccine (OPV) to children aged 0-5 years. A total of 186 children were successfully vaccinated across the three specific booths during the operational period of 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM. The combined efforts of a fixed facility and high-traffic transit points ensure robust coverage. The campaign successfully leads by the viii sem BSc nursing students.



Booth-wise Performance Overview

Key Operational Highlights

- * Total Vaccinated: 186 children were immunized across the three locations.
- * Operational Hours: The vaccination activity commenced at 8:00 AM and concluded at 5:00 PM at all three booths.
- * Logistics and Staffing: All booths were managed by dedicated health workers, ASHA/Anganwadi staff, and local volunteers. Their efficient crowd management and rigorous maintenance of the cold chain were key to the drive's success.
- * Targeting Strategy: The strategic placement of booths ensured that the

campaign successfully reached both the stationary population (via the FWC) and the mobile population (via the bus stands), minimizing the risk of missing any eligible child.
