Report Of School Health Programme Conducted on 05-05-2023

INTRODUCTION

A medical camp for children between the age of 3-19 years was conducted on 05-May-2023 at Rangaprabhat Children's Theater, Venjaramoodu by Sree Gokulam Medical College and Sree Gokulam Nursing College to conduct were selected. Health screening and medical checkup of the students were carried out.

The programme was jointly organized by department of faculties and students in medical surgical nursing, paediatric nursing, and community health nursing. It was co-ordinated by 2nd year Post Bsc (N), Msc (N) 1st year and 2nd year students.

OBJECTIVES

- To perform health screening of school children.
- To bring health awareness in school children.
- To encourage children and their parents to adapt healthy habits.

REPORT

Programme commenced at 09:30 AM with registration process. After registration, children were screened by 2nd year Post Bsc (N), Msc (N) 1st year and 2nd year students. Screening included anthropometric measurement, head-to-foot examination and BMI calculation.

Further to screening children were escorted to pediatric OPD.

Dr Shameem and team of pediatric OPD examined the children and referred them to corresponding sections of ENT, dental and Ophthalmology accordingly. ENT, dental and Ophthalmology were headed by Dr Diyasree, Dr Athira, Dr Abhirami, Dr Kelvin respectively.

The medical team conducted checkup for total 141 beneficiaries.

The composition included

128 students and 13 faculties.

69 males and 72 female.





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Categories of age group

Pre schoolers (3-5yrs) – 22

School age (6 – 12yr) – 104

Adolescents (13- 19) – 2

Adults – 13

Other finding

All students were reported to be immunized according to their age.

22 students were referred to ophthalmology OPDs, out of which 7 were found to have Myopia.

38 students with either dental carriers or improper dental hygiene were referred to Dental OPDs.

22 students were referred to ENT OPDs.

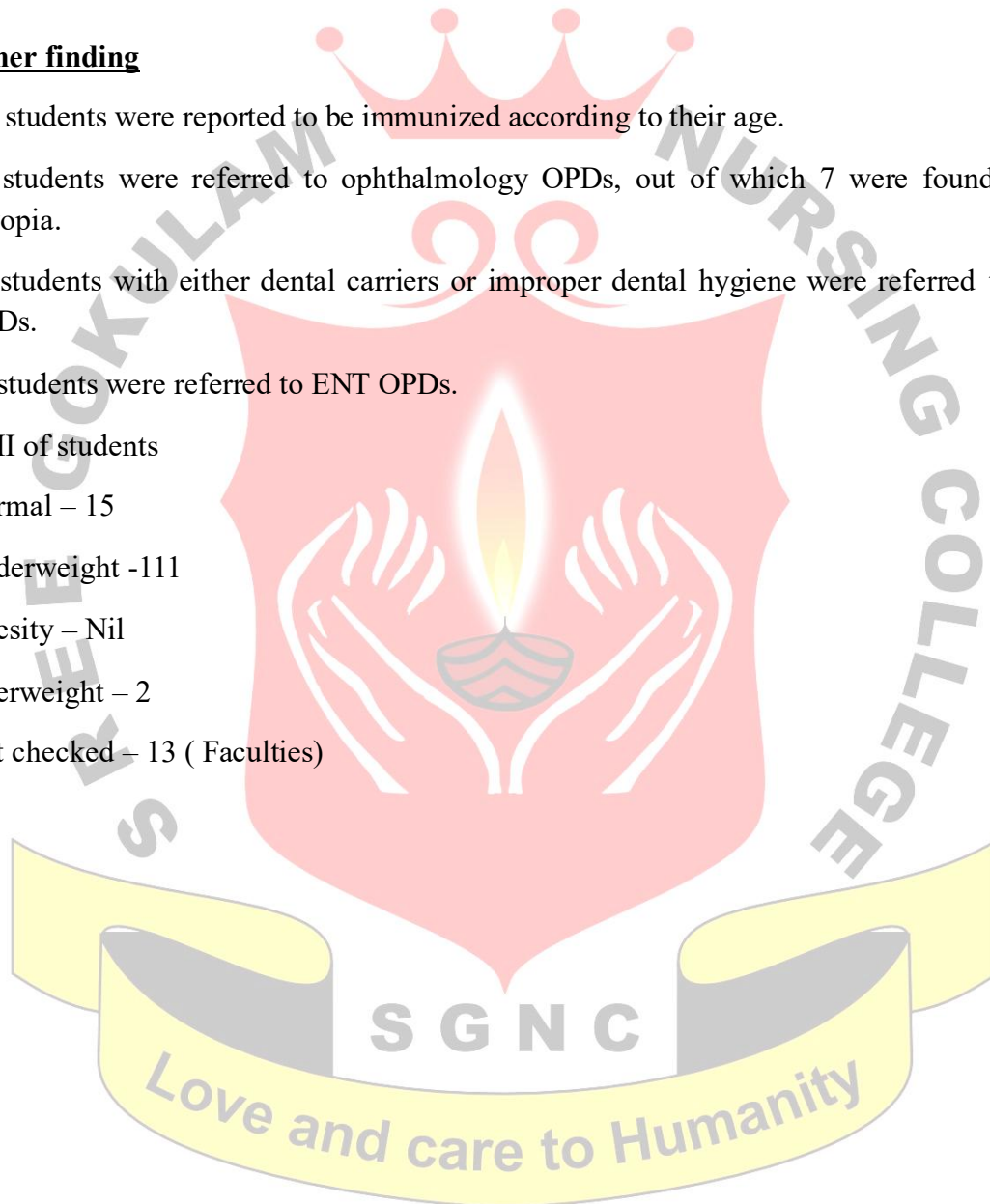

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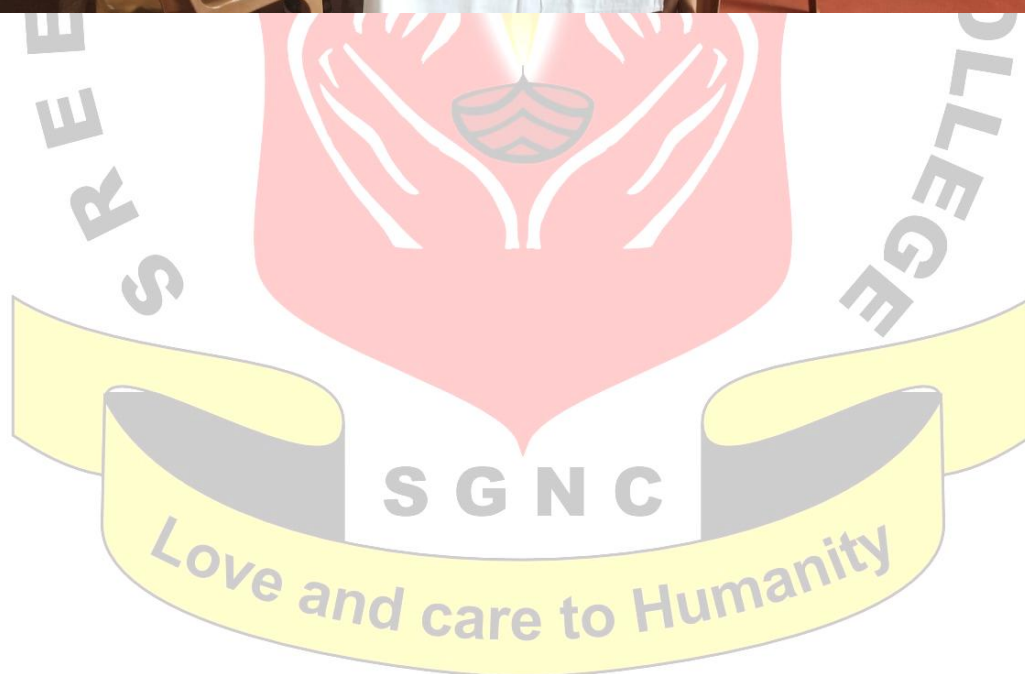
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CONCLUSION
